- [University of Florida](#): The EDIS website contains all current peer-reviewed publications from UF's *Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences*.
- [University of California, Davis & Riverside](#): Free publications on topics ranging from water, home gardens, rangeland management, irrigation and more.
- [University of Illinois](#): Access to publications, learning kits, and instructional materials in a wide variety of topics dealing with agriculture.

# Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) online Resources

FAO provides a wealth of information on agriculture and livelihoods through their website. This is a great resource for publications and statistics, especially for those interested in gender and rural livelihoods.

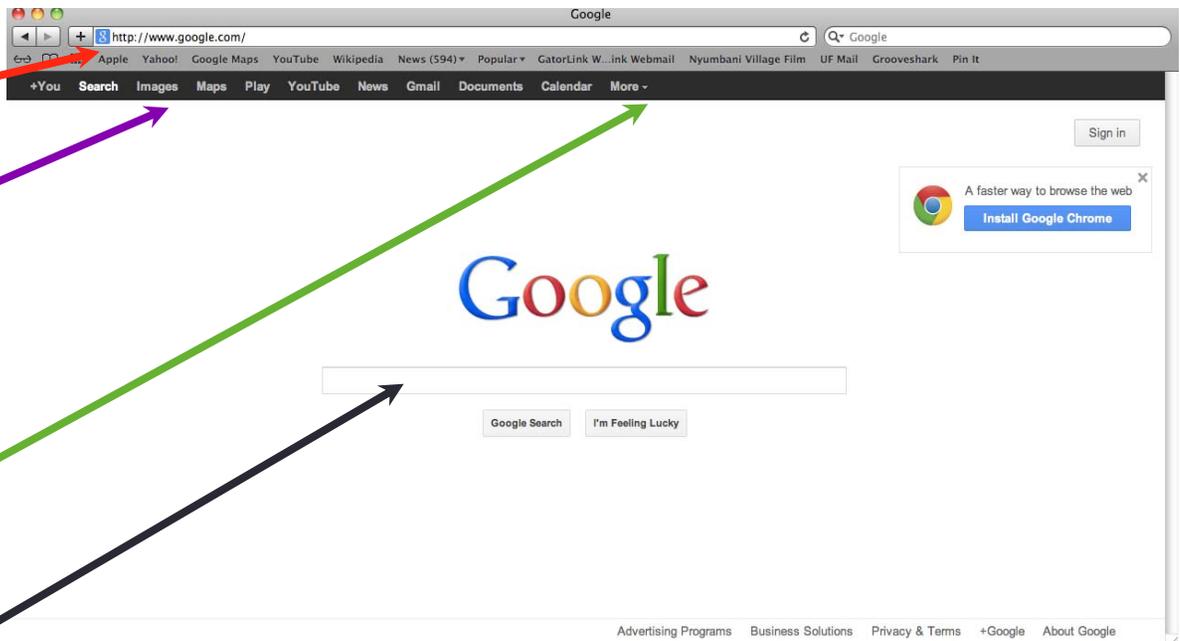
- The FAO website can be accessed at [www.fao.org](http://www.fao.org)
- At the top menu bar, you can choose your preferred language.
- To the right, there are several search options. For example:
  - If there is a particular topic or issue that you are interested in, you can type it in the search bar
  - You can explore publications published by FAO by selecting this “Publications” tab. Once at the “Publications” site, you can navigate based by subject (e.g., gender and rural livelihoods)
  - You can search for statistics based on a particular subject or country.



# How to use Google Search

Google can be a useful tool to explore a wide range of resources on the internet. Through different search options, you can explore videos, articles, and images which can be helpful to your research regarding agriculture and extension

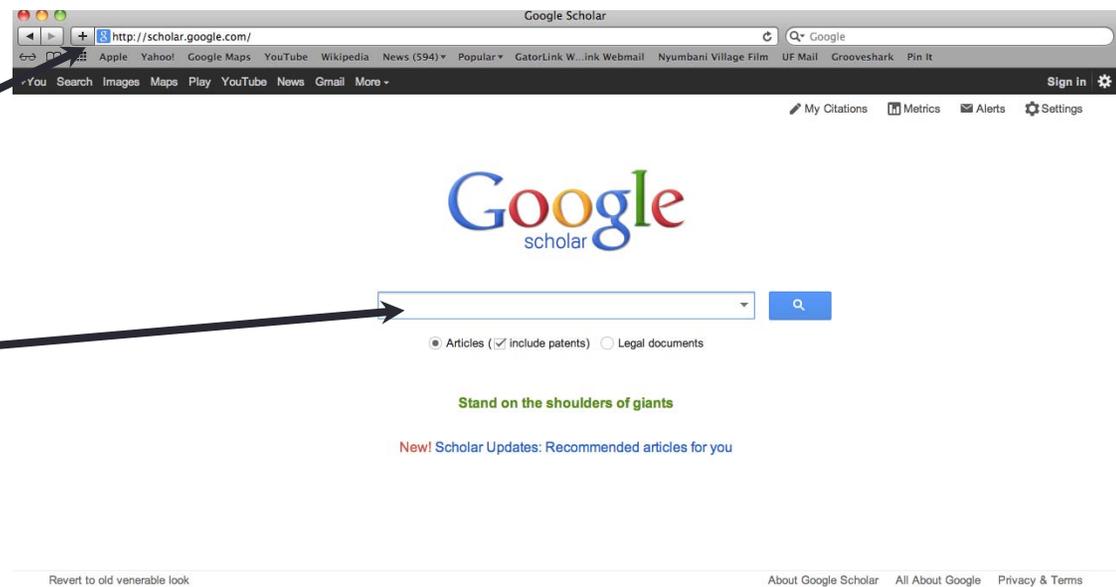
- You can find the search engine at [www.google.com](http://www.google.com)
- You can use the menu bar located at the top of the screen to select different types of searches including “images”, “maps”, and “news”. Depending on the type of information you are interested in collecting, these options can help you to collect information most relevant to your specific needs.
- You can also specify the type of information you would like to gather using the options listed under the “More” tab on the menu bar. You will see, search options include “translation”, “photos”, “books”, and “videos”.
- You can make a general search by typing the specific terms in which you are interested into the search box.



# What is Google Scholar

Another useful resource is Google Scholar. Unlike the Google search which provides a more general search with very many results, the Google Scholar search only provides those articles which are scholarly sources. These sources are often excerpts from books or articles in scholarly journals. Using Google Scholar is one way of narrowing down your search in order to maximize the number of relevant resources relevant to your specific interests.

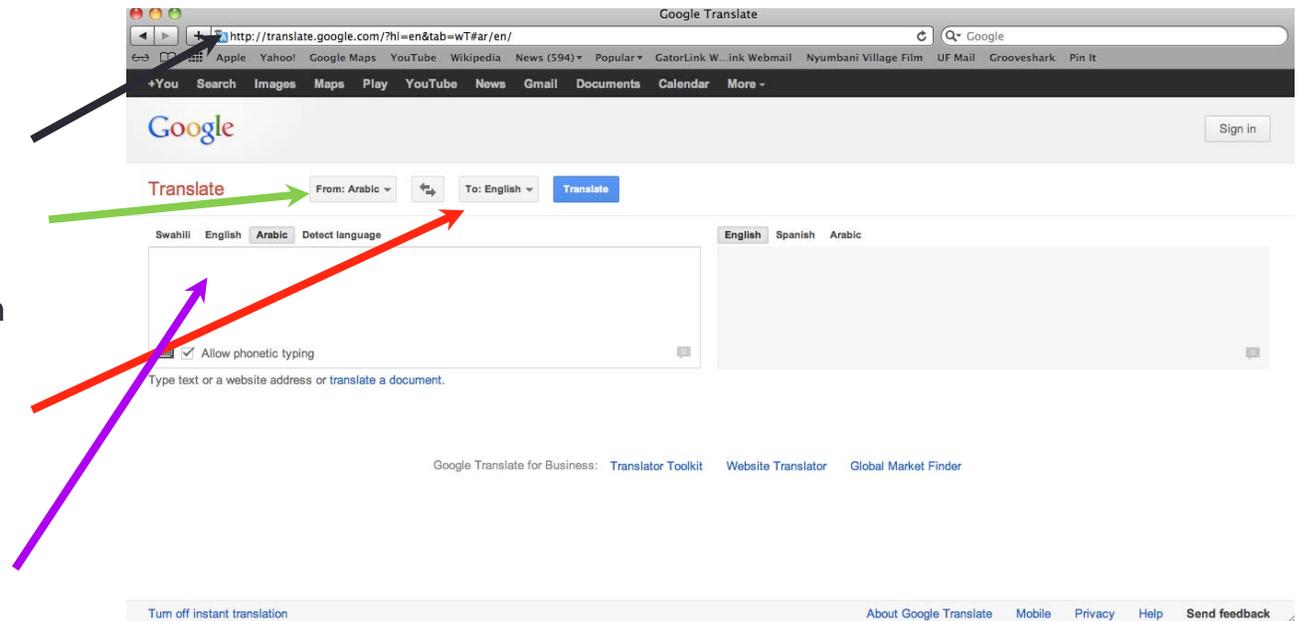
- You can find the search engine at [www.scholar.google.com](http://www.scholar.google.com)
- You can type your search terms into google scholar, and will receive a list of scholarly articles, book excerpts, and citations which may be relevant to your topic.
- Some times general search topics(for example “wheat”) may produce a lot of results which are not relevant to your research interests. If you do not find articles directly related to your topic, try some new search terms that are perhaps more specific to your research topic (such as “wheat production”, “gender” and “Badia”).



# What is Google Translate

Another useful tool offered through Google search engine is Google Translate. This site allows you to translate your work into many different languages and can be very useful when working in communities or research teams where more than one language is being used to communicate.

- Google Translate can be found at <http://translate.google.com>
- Choose the language you would like to translate from (the language that the document is already written in).
- Choose the language you would like to translate into.
- Type/paste the section of the document that you would like translated into this box.
